## **Free Community Diabetes Empowerment Education Program Available Soon in Lawrence County**

Are you living with diabetes or pre-diabetes? The Area Agency on Aging District 7 (AAA7), along with the Ohio Department of Aging, will soon be offering a special diabetes education program in Proctorville that is free and open to the community.

The Diabetes Empowerment Education Program™ (DEEP) is open to anyone age 60 or older who is on Medicare or Medicare/Medicaid. Over the six-week workshop, participants will meet for two hours each week and discuss the following modules:

- Module 1. Beginning Sessions & Understanding the Human Body
- Module 2. Understanding Risk Factors for Diabetes
- Module 3. Monitoring Your Body
- Module 4. Get Up and Move! Diabetes & Physical Activity
- Module 5. Management of Diabetes Through Meal Planning
- Module 6. Diabetes Complications: Identification and Prevention
- Module 7. Learning about Medications & Medical Care
- Module 8. Living with Diabetes: Mobilizing Your Family and Friends

An upcoming DEEP workshop will be held in Proctorville starting May 3<sup>rd</sup> and ending June 7<sup>th</sup>. Participants will meet on Wednesdays from 12 Noon until 2:00 pm at New Hope United Methodist Church, located at 111 Township Road 1130 in Proctorville.
