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Chronic Disease Self-Management Program Available **Soon in Wheelersburg to the Community**

Live in Scioto County or surrounding communities? Do you or someone you know have long-term health challenges such as asthma, arthritis, heart disease, diabetes, and other life-long health conditions? Would you like to gain confidence and new skills to manage your chronic conditions and feel healthier?

The Chronic Disease Self-Management Program (CDSMP) is made possible by a joint effort of the Ohio Department of Aging and the Area Agency on Aging District 7 (AAA7).

Participants in the CDSMP program will gain needed support in addition to a number of other benefits including:

- Learning practical ways to deal with pain, fatigue and depression
- Discovering ways to be more physically active
- Learning how to eat healthier
- Learning better ways to talk with your physician and family about your health
- Setting personal goals
- Finding ways to relax and deal with stress

The free six-week workshop will be offered at the Wheelersburg Baptist Church Community Center, located at 11712 Gallia Pike in Wheelersburg. Sessions over the six-week period will be held on Tuesdays from September 5th through October 10th. Each session will be held from 12:30 pm until 3:00 pm. Those participating should attend all six sessions.

The Chronic Disease Self-Management Program is open to anyone age 60 or older at no cost. Participants in the program can represent individuals with any of the conditions mentioned previously, be a caregiver of someone with these conditions, or be someone who simply wants to learn more about healthy living.
